
Mathematics

This term, students will be given many differentiated hands-on opportunities to explore and understand:

- numbers to 20 and beyond
- place value
- · days of the week and months of the vear
- comparing numbers (before/after, more/less)
- addition and subtraction.

Specialists

In STEM class, students will delve into the fundamentals of direction and coding using Beebots. They'll start by learning to identify directions and create patterns that others can follow. Gradually, they will transition into coding Beebots by applying their understanding of direction to program these robots. Through this hands-on

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Enalish

The children will be involved in a wide variety of specific activities to develop their skills in reading, writing, viewing and oral language. They will:

- use personal experiences to write short texts
- use letter/sound knowledge. environmental print and sight
- words when writing and reading • learn about the structure of a simple
- sentence (capital letters and full stops)
- engage in reading opportunities everyday.

Our W@M lessons this term will focus on ways to display kindness to others and problem solving

Physical Education & Health

Students will be involved in regular P.E. sessions throughout the week that will focus on the fundamental motor skills. Our Health focus will be on personal hygiene and building strategies to use the Zones of Regulation when coping with big emotions.

Science

This term we have begun looking at Earth Sciences focusing on weather, seasons and natural disasters. This science based unit will see the children observing the weather and what affect it has on people, what we wear, activities we do and our environment. By the end of this unit students will understand:

- What are the different types of weather and seasons?
- What are some examples of natural disasters?
- How they can adapt to different conditions.

Integrated Inquiry Unit - HASS

LSGHM will explore contributions to communities. Students will discuss the following questions: Who is our community? What do we value in our community and why? How are we responsible for creating a safe, respectful learning environment? What are the benefits of being part of a community group?

Librarv

LSGHM class will all have a borrowing session in the Library. They will occur on Monday mornings. Please encourage your child to bring a library bag to school as they will require one in order to borrow books.



The Arts

This term we will focus on visual arts and music. Students will develop a variety of skills that will help children express themselves creatively as they become aware of rhythm, pitch, dynamics and expression, form and structure, timbre and texture of music. They will explore sounds as they learn to listen to ad make music and learn to discriminate between sounds and silence, and loud and soft sounds.

In visual arts lessons explore how and why artworks are created and ways to use and apply visual conventions, such as line, shape, colour and texture

learn how their ideas or subject matter can be developed through different forms, styles, techniques, materials and technologies.
