Mathematics

This term, students will be given many hands-on opportunities to understand and explore:

- Addition and subtraction
- Place Value
- Days of the week and months of the year
- Subitising
- Practising the 'counting on' strategy



English

The children will be involved in a wide variety of specific activities to develop their skills in reading, writing, viewing and oral language. Children will:

- Use personal experiences to write short texts
- Learn about the structure of a simple sentence (capital letter and full stops)
- Explore different text types

Science

This term we have begun looking at earth sciences focussing on landforms with a student led interest on Natural Disasters. This science based unit will see the children observing how our earth changes. By the end of this unit students will understand:

- How they can influence their natural environments.

This term we will focus on visual arts and music. Students will develop a variety of skills that will help children express themselves creatively as they become aware of rhythm, pitch, dynamics and expression, form and structure, timbre and texture of music. They will explore sounds as they learn to listen to and make music and learn to discriminate between sounds and silence, and loud and soft sounds.

In visual arts lessons explore how and why artworks are created and ways to use and apply visual conventions, such as line, shape, colour and texture
