2024 Swimming Carnival and Aqua Fun Day – Years 2 to 6 Monday 26 February 2024

Dear Parents and Carers

The 2024 Swimming Carnival and Aqua Fun Day have been organised with both competitive and noncompetitive swimmers in mind with a strong focus on engagement and fun. The 50m indoor heated pool, learner pool and the outdoor area at Stromlo Leisure Centre will be utilised. Students 8yrs+ will have the opportunity to participate in competitive swimming. Students who are not competitively swimming will participate in a range of structured novelty events throughout the day.

If your child is doing competitive races we would like them to be at the pool at 8am. This allows us to swim test and begin races prior to non-racers arriving at the pool. Those children should be dropped off by parents to Stromlo pool – if this is not possible for your family please reach out to other families who may be able to take multiple children. All other children should arrive at school, with their swimwear, between 8.40-9.00. Late students may miss the bus and in this case they will stay at school for the day and no refund will be possible.

The Royal Life Saving Society ACT Survival Challenge Proficiency Test will be conducted prior to any water activities. This test will include 4 steps:

- 1- Perform a slide-in-entry and walk 5 metres of water with acceptable stability and coordination.
- 2- Swim **continuously** for 25 metres using an action that resembles a stroke.
- 3- Perform survival scull, float and tread water for 1 minute in deep water. Call for help once within this time.
- 4- Exit water unassisted.

This will be conducted by the qualified Lifequard staff from the Stromlo Leisure Centre. Decisions made by the testers are final and cannot be appealed.

Based on the results of the proficiency test and your responses to our permission note, your child will be allocated a coloured wrist band that indicates their swimming ability and which pool they can access. Red indicates no swimming ability. Green indicates novelties only. Blue is competitive and novelties. Please see the attached map for areas students with those colours can access.

Parents, carers and other family members are invited and encouraged to come along. Entry cost to the pool is \$2.85 (prices subject to change) which is payable at the gate upon entry. If you can provide assistance on the day with time keeping or marshalling, please contact Melissah.Cook@ed.act.edu.au or Andrew.Gibson@ed.act.edu.au.

A school swimming team will be selected from the results of the day to represent Macgregor at the Belconnen Region Swimming Carnival later in Term 1, 2024. Please note: the school representative team will be selected

PO Box 372 KIPPAX ACT 2615 on times and stroke technique – finishing in the top 4 **does not** automatically guarantee a child a place in the school team.

Only students who turn 8 in 2024 can enter swimming races. Events will be called by age and gender on the day and students who wish to compete will be marshalled and entered in the event at the pool. Naturally, they must be able to swim at least 50m in the event stroke.

All children must have the following 3 notes to attend:

- Swimming Carnival permission note
- Aquatic Activities permission note
- Medical Information and Consent form

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

Red must stay in water less than 0.90m deep, marked out in red box. Can only be in Leisure pool and on splash park.
