### **Mathematics**

This term, students will be given many hands-on opportunities to understand and explore:

-Number awareness, including names, symbols and ordering numbers to 10. -Identifying, extending and creating patterns

-Sorting and describing 2D shapes

-Identifying the days of the week and how to read a calendar.

### <u>Base</u>

This term Kindergarten will be taking part in BASE assessment. This assessment happens in all Kindergarten classes across Australia. This is completed on a computer with your child's teacher. The program assesses a child's early literacy and numeracy skills. You will receive a base report later this year to help give you a picture of your child's progress.

Our W@M lessons this term will focus on ways to display kindness to others, problem solving during games, school and classroom expectations.

#### <u>English</u>

We will be developing early reading skills such as identifying rhyme and syllables in language, initial sounds, concepts of print, and comprehending what has been read. Toward the middle of the term, we will commence our home reading program. This term we will begin using a evidence based phonics' program called Initialit, in which we will use songs, actions, fine motor activities and games to teach the letters and sounds of the alphabet. In writing, teachers will use the 'I do, we do, you do' model. Children will be encouraged to independently write after modelling and guided practise.

## Integrated Inquiry Unit

This term we have begun looking at how living things have basic needs. Your child will be exploring animals and plants as well as learning about sustainability and how our local land has been cared for by Indigenous people over thousands of years. The children will explore the importance of reusing, repurposing, recycling and composting materials from home and how environmentally friendly practices are achieved through sustainable activities. The children are learning the inquiry skills of questioning and communicating as well as the scientific process skills of observing, questioning, and researching.

# Library

Kindergarten children will participate in a library lesson with their class teacher on Mondays. Please encourage your children to bring a library bag to school as they will require one in order to borrow books.



### Physical Education & Health

Students will be involved in regular P.E. sessions throughout the week that will focus on the fundamental motor skills.
