A reminder to all parents and carers to drive safely around the school. In particular:

- * Do not try to overtake in the Yerrabi Yuumma turning circle at the front of the school.
- * When coming out of Yerrabi Yuumma onto Hirschfeld Crescent please turn right only.
- * Consider parking in the Kings Swim carpark and walking across to the Clode Place gate rather than trying to drive in and around Clode Place.
- * Use part way points such as the bottom of Swift Place or the carpark at the Oval, rather than a school carpark.

federal budget

2022-23

The Morrison Government handed down the federal budget this week on Tuesday.

How did families fair?

- \$1500 tax break Australian workers earning under \$126,000 a year will score a one-off tax bonus budget that will deliver a tax cut of up to \$1500 in July.
- **Childcare subsidy increases**, brought forward from July 1 to March 7, will leave the average family more than \$2200 per year better off.
- **Fuel excise** will be cut in half for the next six months. The 22c cut will started from midnight on Tuesday, providing relief to households within two weeks when it flows through to the bowsers.
